
WHAT IS ACT?

- Building networks of people and places across the state that are working together to identify solutions that transform systems shaping child wellbeing
- Bringing together residents, youth, city
 officials and community leaders who know
 their cities best to co-design solutions
- Healing the adversities affecting all of California's children today and transform their future.



THE CHALLENGES

- There are a complex set of systems that shape the places our children live, play, learn, and grow
- There is evidence that these systems are failing to meet the needs of far too many of California's children
- Young people are left with unresolved traumas that often last a lifetime
- The result is poor health, limited educational and job opportunities and fewer opportunities to succeed overall



OUR CURRENT REALITIES



REALITY #1

- COVID-19 is negatively impacting children, particularly those most vulnerable
- COVID-19 has affected individuals and communities unequally -- exacerbated by pre-existing inequities

REALITY #2


- Children and families are living in the midst of one of the biggest racial uproars in recent history
- Children of color have been re-traumatized by witnessing constant police brutality against BIPOC



SOURCES OF CHILDHOOD TRAUMA

DIRECT TRAUMA

- Physical, sexual, and emotional abuse and neglect
- · Witness to domestic violence
- Parental alcohol/drug abuse, mental illness
- Loss of caregiver from death, divorce, and imprisonment



GENERATIONAL TRAUMA


- Personal/Structural Racism
- Concentrated Poverty
- Lack of Social Support
- Forced Displacement

COMMUNITY TRAUMA

- Witness to Police Brutality
- Witness to violence/threat
- · Lack of safe housing
- Community Disinvestment




IMPACTS OF CHILDHOOD TRAUMA






SYMPTOMS OF COMMUNITY TRAUMA





WHAT WOULD PARTICIPATION LOOK LIKE?



1. Establish a Core Team

- 2 or more residents
- 2 or more city officials/staff
- 2 or more Community-based representatives from organizations that advocate/create policy for child wellbeing
- 2. Assigned an ACT-CA coach to help define an Action Area
- 3. Expand the Core Team to a Design Team of a broad representation of youth, community residents and organizations that support child wellbeing
- 4. Join a Learning Community



YOUTH DESIGN TEAMS



- Central to ACT-CA is ensuring youth voices of the most vulnerable youth are heard
- Each city will have a Youth Design Team to inform the issues that will be addressed
- The Youth Design Teams create a leadership pipeline to better understand and promote policy changes -- so that
